

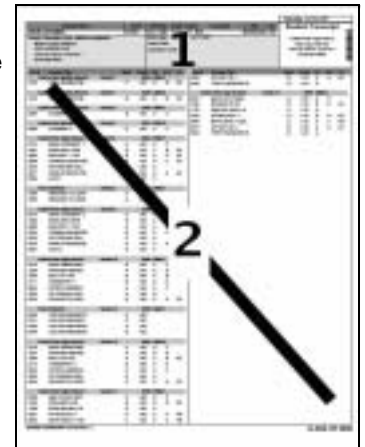


TRANSCRIPT INFORMATION

This document will help you interpret the information found in each section of the transcript. Use the Example Page graphics below to help you find the section being described. If you have additional questions about this academic record, please direct them to your student's school counselor.

Section 1: Student Demographic Information: Basic information about the student including ID number, birth date, gender, grade, mailing address and Social Security Number. The EC number is the ethnic code used as one method of complying with state and federal requirements for reports on academic progress.

Section 2: Historical Course List: Courses taken by the student are grouped by grading period. The most recent courses are at the top, left. Where necessary, Section 2 extends onto the next column on the first page of the transcript (p.2).

Courses are shown for all grades served by the current school. On a high school transcript, any courses taken in middle school that apply toward college admission (Math, World Language) will also appear in Section 2. Middle School courses *do not apply toward high school graduation*.

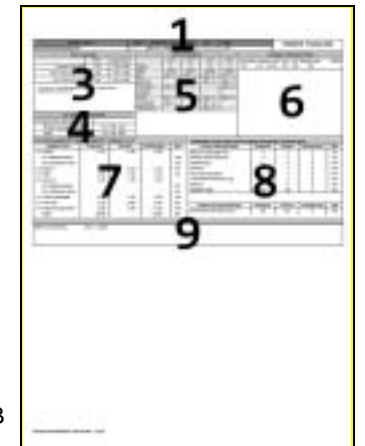
Column titles for Section 2:

- Crs ID** SUHSD course number
- Course Title** The name of the course
- Mark:** The final academic grade received
- Credit:** The number of credits applicable toward graduation. Credits are only issued for passing grades (D or higher).
- Cit:** The final citizenship grade received.
- A-G:** A letter in this column indicates that the course credit applies to a specific subject area for admission to the UC and CSU systems. Courses with no code do not meet a requirement. Section 7 summarizes college eligibility.

- LC:** Designates the Level of Coursework for advanced and accelerated classes.

Section 3: Grade Point Average (GPA) Summary: Each mark receives points for calculating GPA (see SUHSD Grading Scale on reverse). Courses with LC codes AP, H or IB (see Section 2) receive weighted points. All others are unweighted. Calculated by dividing the sum of the grade points by credits attempted.

Overall Wtd GPA: This SUHSD GPA uses weighted points for all courses designated H, AP, or IB in the LC column of Section 2. It includes only those courses taken in the grades served by the current school (Middle, 7-8; Jr. High, 7-9; Sr. High, 9-12).

"A-G" Wtd UC GPA and "A-G" Wtd CSU GPA: Follows UC or CSU guidelines, uses the weighted scale, and includes only those courses with an A-G designation (see Section 2) taken after 9th grade. Calculation of either university GPAs is a close estimate; the university's calculation is official.

Class rank is based on the GPA and the number of students actively enrolled at the school on the day the transcript is generated or the date of graduation.

Section 4: CA State Graduation Requirements: The State of California imposes certain requirements for high school graduation. Students must pass both the English and Math sections of the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE). They must also meet an Algebra requirement.

Section 5: Standardized Test Information: Scores for up to three of the student's most recent standardized tests. All scores reported in this section are for tests that are part of California's Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) system. May include one or more of the following:

CST: California Standards Test. Reported as scaled score followed by a proficiency level in parentheses. The table on the right describes the numeric proficiency level.

CAT6: California Achievement Test 6. Reported as percentile followed by stanine in parentheses.

Section 6: College Admission Tests: Colleges require most students to take one or more admission tests. This section lists results that have been provided to the district by the testing agencies. Your high school student may have results for one or more of the tests listed below. Tables on the right indicate the meaning of the score keys.

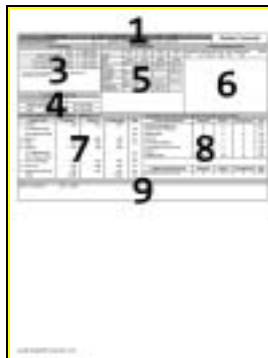

Section 7: College admission requirements: This section shows progress toward meeting credit requirements for entrance into a UC or CSU college. Each of the seven subject areas (labeled A-G) has a credit requirement. Credits earned and outstanding are shown for each, along with an indication of whether or not the requirement has been met. When a subject requirement is met, any remaining earned credits in that subject are added to Electives (G). The UC and CSU systems differ in their requirements for History (A), so their data are separated on two lines.

Section 8: SUHSD Graduation Requirements: Sweetwater students must pass at least 44 credits in grades 9-12 to graduate. This table lists graduation credits required, earned, and needed (outstanding) in each subject area. The column on the right indicates whether the requirement has been met. If the student has received any waivers or adjustments to the standard graduation plan, they appear beneath the credits table. All high school students have an additional listing at the bottom of Section 8 that shows progress toward completion of the 30-hour community service graduation requirement.

Section 9: Comments: Lists additional honors and miscellaneous information. May include California Scholarship Federation and National Merit Scholarship. Includes verification of SB813 Counseling for high school students where appropriate.
